Who is the only woman to ever swear in a United States president?

That would be Sarah Tilghman Hughes, Texas' first female federal judge. On Nov. 22, 1963, she was called to a Dallas area airport, boarded a plane, Air Force One to be exact, and swore in President Lyndon B. Johnson, just hours after the assassination of John F. Kennedy. The iconic photo shows Judge Hughes with her back to the camera as she takes the oath of office from LBJ, with a shocked Jackie Kennedy standing at his side. She became a DG at a now-closed chapter: Psi (II) at Goucher College in Maryland.
